Shelburne Farms Shoreline

Shelburne, Vermont



In 1982 the Lake Champlain Land Trust worked with the Webb family to conserve several miles of forested shoreline within what is now the historic and world renowned Shelburne Farms. A walk along the shoreline of this unique property takes you through mature Limestone Bluff Cedar-Pine forest with views of the lake beyond. This unique natural community, found only along the lakeshore in Vermont, is becoming more rare as shoreline is developed. The best way to view the protected shoreline, as well as Lake Champlain and the Adirondack Mountains, is to take the trails to the top of Lone Tree Hill.





Directions and Park Information:

From Burlington, follow Route 7 South about 4 miles. Turn right onto Bay Rd and follow it until you come to a T. Shelburne Farms will be in front of you.

Shelburne Farms has an extensive trail system perfect for walking and birdwatching. Please note that Shelburne Farms has an admission fee during the warmer months. Pick up a trail guide at the entrance for the property's complete trail system.
